Personal Social and Emotional Development

- Anti-bullying odd socks day.
- Children in Need pyjama/sports day.
- How we are similar and different to our friends...

- Begin to accept the needs of others and share school resources - Can I let my friend have a turn of the toys?

Literacy

- Say/sing rhymes and songs (on CDs and IWB) linked to the topic.

- Writing encourage children to make story maps and draw pictures of their favourite characters.
- Writing letters to Father Christmas, list of toys.
- Sequence short stories and talk about principal characters.
- Letters and Sounds Phase 1 Aspect 2, 3 & 4.
- Recognise familiar words and logos such as signs, advertising logos and their own name.

Physical Development

- Develop gross motor skills by moving in a range of ways such as, slithering, shuffling, rolling, crawling, walking, running, jumping, hopping and sliding.
- Use climbing equipment and encourage children to take risks.
- Develop fine motor skills through malleable and sensory experiences such as; poking, rolling, pinching, squeezing and twisting a range of materials.
- Draw lines and circles and begin to copy some letters from their names.
- Look at what happens to our body when we exercise.

- Brain Freeze Experiment How does ice melt?
- Humpty Dumpty Egg Experiment How can we keep him safe?
- Gingerbread Biscuits What ingredients do you need?

Communication and Language

Mathematics

- Create number museums for numbers 1-5.
- Begin to represent numbers using fingers, objects and marks on paper - encourage this through play and adult led games.
- Where do you see numbers? How can we represent numbers?
- Continue to count 1-10.
- Encourage children to notice not only objects but anything can be counted.
- Recognise numerals of personal significance talk about birthdays and how old children are in our class.
- Introduce 2D shapes, triangle and square.
- Order items by size or length.

Expressive Arts and Design

- Role play area let's pretend we work in a Post Office.
- Explore colours and how they can be changed firework painting, chalk pictures and Halloween crafts.
- Explore different materials and describe the textures of them; soft, smooth, bumpy, rough, hard etc.
- Move rhythmically ribbon dancing, dough disco and joining in with Christmas songs.
- Create Christmas cards and decorations.
- Construct, stack blocks vertically and horizontally Can you make a home for Father Christmas? Can you build a sleigh for the reindeers?
